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Key vocabulary	Definition
London	the capital city of England and the United Kingdom
Bakery	a place where bread and cakes are made.
Eyewitness	a person who saw an event and can give a description of it.
Fire hooks	a giant hook used to pull houses down.
Firebreak	a gap that stops a fire spreading to nearby buildings.
Flammable	something that burns easily.
Embers	small pieces of glowing coal or wood in a dying fire
Thatched roof	a roof made of dry vegetation such as straw and reeds

Key vocabulary	Definition
Life processes	all living things do like move, breathe, sense, grow, get rid of waste and get their energy from food.
Habitat	a place that an animal or plant lives. It provides the animal or plant with food, water and shelter.
Inhabitant	a person or animal that lives in a place.
Microhabitat	a very small, specific habitat for animals and plants.
Food chain	shows how each animal gets its food from each other.
Depend	many living things in a habitat depend on each other. This means they need each other for different things.





## Subject: Geography - Using maps and compass directions

Key vocabulary	Definition
Sketch map	a simple map with only basic details.
Key	helps us understand map symbols.
Compass rose	this is printed on a map to show different directions.
Map symbol	a picture or a sign on a map that represents something else.
Route	a way of getting from a start point to a finish point.
Compass	a tool which shows people which direction they are travelling in and helps them find their way.
Aerial view	a view from above. Also known as a 'bird's-eye' view.
Continent	a very large area of land that includes all the islands with it. There are seven continents: Africa, Antarctica, Oceania, Asia, Europe, North America and South America.
